- Test your carbon monoxide detectors. A carbon monoxide leak is one of the biggest safety threats that a malfunctioning furnace can pose to your health.
- Test your smoke alarms. Certain severe furnace problems can lead to fire hazards.
- Keep the area around your furnace clear. You can help minimize the chance of fire hazards from your furnace by keeping the area around your system clear.
- Change your air filter when it's dirty. A dirty air filter will restrict airflow to your furnace, which will overwork your system and potentially increase the risk of a carbon monoxide leak. In addition, a dirty filter will allow dirt to build up on your furnace's components, which can cause a number of efficiency, performance and safety issues.
